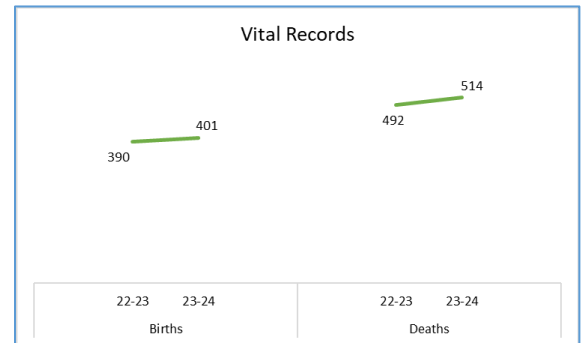
HEALTH DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

We continue to work with the Sampson County Community Wellness Committee to partner and focus on the areas identified in our community health assessment while continuing to provide much needed safety net services to Sampson County residents. WOMEN, INFANTS & CHILDREN WIC

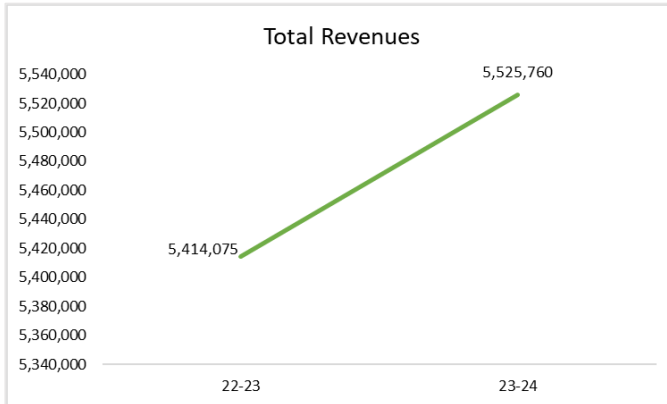

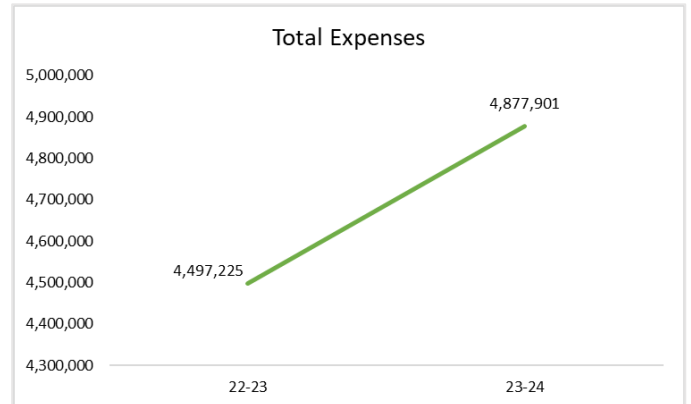

PUBLIC HEALTH HIGHLIGHTS

- The over-the-counter Naloxone forms in the **Adult Health** clinic no longer require a prescription for distribution.
- The **Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)** received the United Way of Sampson County grant for \$5,000 to provide mammograms, ultrasounds and breast biopsies to uninsured or underinsured minority females.
- **Environmental Health** rolled out the on-site permitting software program, Iworqs.
- The **Family Planning** clinic expanded services by providing extended clinical hours to increase access to contraceptives.
- The **Immunizations** program provided clinics to all schools for Tdap/MenQuadfi vaccinations and successfully integrated the new Bridge Program for Covid-19 vaccines.
- An **STD Express Clinic** was implemented offering self-collection for clients with no symptoms.
- The **Tuberculosis (TB)** program received funding from the American Lung Association to provide food, clothing, and other items for a TB patient in isolation. Two of three TB patients completed treatment.
- **WIC** continued to provide some services to clients via telephone. WIC also received an increase in funding.
- **Sampson County Health Department** was awarded \$60,000 from Eastpointe MCO for County Initiatives for Impact of Opioid Use through Coalition Building.
