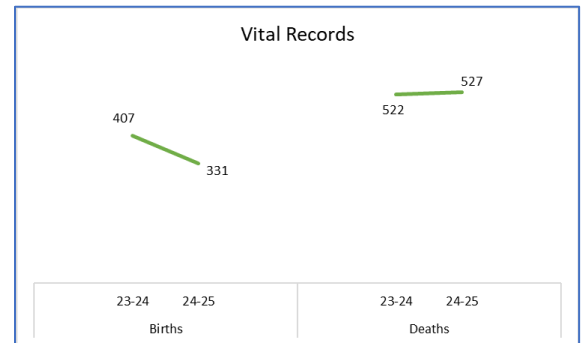
HEALTH DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

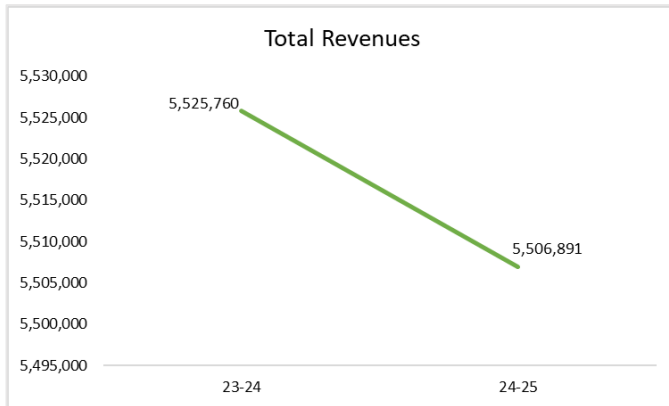

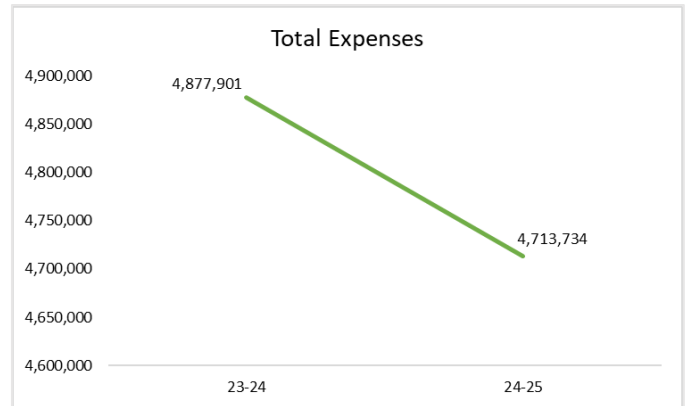

PUBLIC HEALTH HIGHLIGHTS

- The **Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)** exceeded its screening targets and established a contract with ECU for colposcopy services.
- The **Breast & Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP)** received the United Way of Sampson County grant for \$6,300 to provide mammograms, ultrasounds and breast biopsies to uninsured or underinsured minority females.
- The **Child Health** and **STD** state audits were completed with no deficiencies.
- The **Communicable Disease** program increased the percentage of reports sent to the state from 70% to 90%.
- **CMARC** and **CMHRP** staff began a hybrid work schedule in June 2025.
- The **Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support** program reported a decrease in participants' average A1C levels from 7.2 before the class to 6.4 after completing the class.
- **Environmental Health** increased the percentage of Food & Lodging Inspections from 70% to 92%.
- The **Immunizations** program offered Tdap/MenQuadfi vaccinations to upcoming 7th and 12th graders.
- The **Tuberculosis** program expanded and successfully used video Directly Observed Therapy (DOT) for two patients.
- **WIC** maintained its base caseload above 100% and received additional funding.
