- ▶ Applying for new service is easy. Here's what you need:
 1. Completed application
 2. Two forms of ID (ex. valid driver's license or Social Security card)
 3. Proof of ownership of the property
Deed, Receipt or Tax Bill of Property
 4. Payment for your choice of tap size

WHY COUNTY WATER?

Sampson County is pleased to offer your area the opportunity to become a customer of our public water system. Public water systems are:

- **SAFE**

Our water system is constantly tested to ensure we meet and exceed health standards and your family has clean, potable water.

- **LESS EXPENSIVE**

Less expensive than trips to the grocery store to buy an endless supply of bottled water when your well water is not fit for use. The current user rate is \$21.00 per month, and \$5.15 per each 1,000 gallons.

- **AVAILABLE**

Unlike private wells, a public water system is not impacted by power outages.

Steps Following Your Purchase of a Water Tap

Selection of Meter Box Location

Once the contractor has installed the water lines, Public Works will issue you a flag to place where you would like your meter box to be located.

Meter Box Installation

Contractor will install all meter boxes that have been flagged for this project.

Project Approval

Water lines will be energized and tested by contractor. NCDEQ Public Water Supply will issue Final Approval for the project.

Customer Notification

Once Public Works has received the Final Approval, they will mail all customers a letter informing them that the lines are down, taps have been made, and the water is ready for use. The letter will inform customers of what steps they will need to take to activate their water service. The customer will be responsible for obtaining a plumbing permit as well as plumbing the line from the meter box to the residence.

Tap Fees

(during recruitment period)

3/4" tap - \$600

1" tap - \$850

Tap Fees

(after March 11, 2026)

3/4" tap - \$1,200

1" tap - \$1,700
